Your step-by-step guide to sorting, folding and storing your linen, so your cupboard stays calm all year round.

Linen Storage Guide



Start with a clear plan

A beautifully organised linen cupboard starts the same way as any organised space: with everything out and a fresh set of eyes.

Pull out every towel, sheet set, blanket and quilt cover. Lay it all out where you can see it, and be honest about what you actually use.

Sets with worn elastic, scratchy towels and orphaned pillowcases are taking up valuable shelf space. Animal shelters and vets are a great place to donate unwanted bedding and towels, so very little needs to go to landfill.

A good rule of thumb for most households is two to three sets of linen per bed, and two to three towels per person. Enough for one in use, one in the wash, and one spare.

Sort into groups

Once you've narrowed things down, sort what's left into groups.

Most linen cupboards work best when sorted by:

- Bed size (king, queen, single)
- Item type (towels, sheets, quilt covers, blankets)
- Season (everyday vs winter bedding)

Whichever way you sort, keeping complete sheet sets together will save you digging around for a matching pillowcase on changeover day. A simple trick is folding each set inside one of its own pillowcases, so the whole set comes out in one neat bundle.



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Why the right storage matters

Linen cupboards get messy for a simple reason: soft, slippery items stacked loose will always slide, topple and mix together.



Keeps stacks upright and tidy



Protects linen from dust



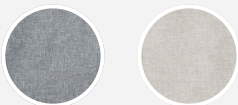

Linen Storage Baskets

Open-top baskets made from durable Oxford cloth with a sturdy frame and a bamboo rim. Perfect for items you reach for often, with easy access from above. Available in light grey and dark grey, sold as sets or individually, and they fold flat when not in use.



FoldAway & SlimFold Boxes

Fully enclosed boxes in a soft cotton and linen blend, designed to keep your linen dust free between uses. Ideal for spare bedding, seasonal items, and anything stored under a bed or on a high shelf. Available in beige and pebble grey, sold as sets or individually, and both fold flat when not in use.



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Choosing the right size

Every linen cupboard is different, so we've broken our range down by what each option is best suited to storing. Towels, sheets and blankets vary in size and thickness, which is why we recommend choosing by category rather than counting items.



Medium Linen Storage Basket

45cm x 30cm x 22.5cm (h)

The everyday workhorse of the linen cupboard.

Ideal for: Towels, sheet sets, quilt covers, and smaller items like pillowcases, face washers and bathmats.



Large Linen Storage Basket

53.5cm x 33cm x 30.5cm (h)

Made for the big, the bulky and the hard to stack.

Ideal for: Bulky bedding, blankets, throws, mattress protectors and cushions.

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SlimFold Linen Storage Box

33.5cm x 13cm x 38cm (h)

A slim, low profile design with a zip and velcro closure for maximum sturdiness. Slides neatly onto shelves and under beds.

Ideal for: Sheet sets and quilt sets.



FoldAway Linen Storage Box

50cm x 41cm x 33cm (h)

A roomy, structured box with a strong metal frame and multiple zip openings, so you can reach what you need without unpacking the lot.

Ideal for: Bulky and seasonal bedding, blankets, throws, cushions and seasonal clothing.

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Set up your zones

When loading everything back in, give each shelf a job:

- Everyday linen at eye level
- Spare and seasonal bedding up high in FoldAway Boxes
- Heavier baskets on lower shelves
- Guest linen together in one spot, ready to grab

If your cupboard is short on space, SlimFold Boxes under the bed are a brilliant way to store spare sheet sets in the room they belong to.



Label for long-term success

Labels and swing tags take the guesswork out of a cupboard full of similar looking stacks. Mark each basket or box by bed size, room or season, and the whole household will be able to find what they need (and put it back where it belongs).



Maintain the calm

Linen cupboards only need a light reset a couple of times a year. When you rotate your bedding for the new season, take a few minutes to wipe down shelves, neaten up the boxes and swap anything seasonal over. A small effort twice a year keeps everything working smoothly.



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Extend the system to your drawers

The same thinking that transforms a linen cupboard works wonders inside your drawers. Our Drawer Organiser Set keeps clothing upright and neatly separated, so you can see every item at a glance.

With three sizes to mix and match, they're perfect for sorting everything from baby clothes and nursery items to everyday underwear, socks and accessories.

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Caring for your linen storage

All of our linen storage is designed for easy care. Simply wipe with a damp cloth as needed and allow to dry fully before restocking.

When a basket or box isn't in use, fold it flat and tuck it away. It will be ready and waiting for the next season, house guest or new addition to the family.

Tip: Make sure linen is completely dry before storing, especially in enclosed boxes. Storing damp linen can lead to musty smells and mildew.
